COMMUNITY

The Cazenovia Central School District is located in a suburban/rural community of approximately 10,000 people, primarily from the townships of Cazenovia, Nelson, Fenner, and the Village of Cazenovia in Madison County, NY. The District, which is located 20 miles southeast of Syracuse, blends historic villages and hamlets with extensive agricultural land. A residential community with agricultural roots, Cazenovia has a diverse socioeconomic spectrum. Residents demonstrate strong support for the school system and a high level of interest in the school's many academic, athletic, and extracurricular programs.

HIGH SCHOOL

Cazenovia High School students are committed to achieving academic excellence, as well as excelling in a variety of extracurricular and interdisciplinary activities. Each student at Cazenovia High School is required to maintain six academic courses, in addition to Physical Education. The high school is run on a block schedule with a four-day rotating cycle. Each block is eighty minutes in length. All courses meet every other day, with the exception of laboratory science courses, which meet three days out of the cycle.

The emphasis of the high school program is on preparing students for post-secondary study. Students are afforded opportunities in core curriculum areas, as well as business, fine arts, agriculture, family and consumer sciences, engineering and computer science.

Vocational opportunities and career exploration are also available to students at Cazenovia High School through BOCES CTE programs and Work Based Learning internships.

CUMULATIVE WEIGHTED & UNWEIGHTED AVERAGE

Cumulative weighted and unweighted averages are determined by calculating all credit bearing courses with the exception of Physical Education, 7th Grade World Language, and any other course that is graded with a Pass/Fail. The unit value of a course is multiplied by the numeric grade to determine the cumulative grade. Those cumulative grades are then added together and divided by the number of potential credits to formulate the weighted and unweighted averages respectively. A seven-semester unweighted cumulative average will be recalculated for each student midyear of senior year. A final weighted and unweighted average will be calculated at the end of eight semesters and will be recorded on the student's final transcript.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A total of 22 units are required for graduation from Cazenovia High School.

*ADDENDUM TO SCHOOL PROFILE *

Program Differences Due to COVID

Cazenovia High School closed in March of 2020 and transitioned to online learning for the remainder of the school year as was the requirement for New York State secondary schools. Students continued <u>all</u> classes remotely. All of the New York State Regents Exams were cancelled by the Governor. Students that were scheduled to take a Regents Examination in June 2020 were exempted due to the COVID-19 pandemic; such exams are indicated with an "E" on the student's transcript.

On September 10, 2020, Cazenovia High School reopened our buildings, giving students an option for remote learning or in-person learning. All students attended school five days a week. Remote students received both synchronous and asynchronous instruction. Both sets of students were subject to the grading system noted in this document. As a high school, we waived the district requirement that mandates students to take six classes, plus physical education in order to offer late entry or early release to help reduce the population in the school building.

While not mandated by New York State, Algebra I, Physical Setting/Earth Science, Living Environment and English Language Arts Regents Exams were administered. Students were given the option to have the grade they earned on the respective exam or an "E" for exemption reflected on their transcripts.

In May of 2022, the New York State Education Department cancelled the U.S. History exam; this exam is indicated with an "E" on the student's transcript. All other Regents exams were administered; however, due to the long-term educational impact of the pandemic, a "Special Appeal" was offered to students who received a score of 50-64. These scores are indicated with an "SA" on the student's transcript.
